### **Grandview Park Presbyterian and La Paz Food Pantry**

Rolling Hills has had a sister church relationship with Grandview Park Presbyterian Church in Wyandotte County for more than 10 years. Rolling Hills members helped with the demolition of Grandview Park's kitchen in preparation for their Cocina de la Paz project. Food, health and beauty supplies, and financial support have been given. Grandview Park provides the La Paz Pantry to people in need around the church. It operates as a bi-weekly program serving 90 to 100 boxes each time. Volunteers help unload the truck from Harvesters, sort the food and prepare the boxes for distribution to the clients on Fridays. Amethyst Place has served nearly 200 women and children each year. They have 37 apartments and many on-site programs for these women and children.
